Departmentalized 4th Grade

We are working with students in a new way again this year. We have divided the 4th grade curriculum so every student will learn according to each teacher's expertise. Students will be switching to four different classes throughout the school day.

Each class period will be 65 minutes, with a few minutes allotted for passing. Students will begin the day by attending a Specialist class each day for 50 minutes. It is important for students to be at school, ready to participate each day.

If there are problems...

Students may be issued a citation for behaviors that impede their learning, or other students' learning. Some examples are:

- insubordination
- distractions (including talking)
- chronic missing homework
- bullying

Citations must be signed by a parent and returned to school. These are used to help correct student behavior, and allow us to discuss the root causes of the behavior. Our commitment is to helping all children be successful in school.

The 4th Grade team will be available to meet with parents before school as needed. Please send an e-mail so that we can set a time when we are all available. Our commitment is to work together so all students are successful in school.

We each use a point system to encourage students' positive and productive behavior. Points will be awarded to students grouped in various teams in each class. Team points will be awarded for positive contributions to our class discussions and modeling good behavior. At the end of each week, the team who has earned the most points will earn a token of appreciation.

Homework

Students are expected to complete math homework each weeknight, and to read every day. We will be participating in a Battle of the Books event in the spring. All students will have the book lists in their binders. Students will also have weekly writing assignments.
